We couldn't make such a powerful impact without you. Thank you.





One-stop care in the Centre for Integrated Diabetes Care

Afflicting 3.7 million Ontarians, chronic conditions like heart disease and diabetes will arguably be the biggest healthcare challenge of the future. Ken Yip Hoi was diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes in 2001. In 2011, his blood sugar levels started spiralling out of control and no amount of medication, diet or exercise could turn the tide. That is, until Ken's family doctor referred him to WCH's Centre for Integrated Diabetes Care.

Ken attributes his dramatic improvement to the centre's exceptional team of doctors, nurses, dietitians, social workers and other specialists who provide one-stop care to patients with diabetes. The centre is just one example of how your gift is helping to bring multiple healthcare providers together under one roof so patients can get the outpatient care they need in fewer hospital visits.

Pioneering prevention and treatment in the Centre for Headache

Migraine headaches are three times more common in women than in men. Linda McRae was battling migraines and nausea almost every day in 2010 when she was referred to WCH's Centre for Headache, Ontario's only academic-based headache centre and a hub of research and treatment for women with the condition. Three years later, she is virtually migraine-free.

Thanks to programs like the Centre for Headache, we understand that the same diseases and conditions affect men and women very differently. We understand the need to focus on previously unexplored areas of women's health. Your gift is helping us continue to pioneer innovations and programs that support women and their families, so that we remain world-renowned experts in women's health and women's health research.

Giving refugees somewhere to turn in the Crossroads Clinic

When Samson's wife and two daughters fled the African State of Eritrea to join him in Canada, one of their first stops was WCH's Crossroads Clinic, Toronto's first healthcare clinic for newly-arrived refugees. A clinic patient since his immigration in 2011, Samson was excited to introduce his family to Dr. Meb Rashid, the clinic's medical director and a "friend and good person."

Since its opening, the Crossroads Clinic has helped as many as 950 newly-arrived refugees a year navigate Canada's medical system by providing comprehensive primary care aimed at preventing chronic diseases such as diabetes and hypertension.
